KINDERGARTEN 5

Our kindergarten students are continuously sharpening their reading skills by reading stories featuring one- and two-vowel words, along with newly introduced sight words like 'says,' 'was,' 'are,' and 'they.' They're also exploring words ending in two consonants, simple compound words like 'bedtime,' and elementary consonant blends such as 'st' in 'stop' and 'spl' in 'splash.' This journey involves not just reading, but also observing punctuation, practicing expressive reading, responding to oral comprehension questions, and defining vocabulary words.



In Math, kindergarteners have delved into subtraction, incorporating catchy songs to aid students in grasping the meanings behind the plus and minus signs. Students are mastering the addition of coins, beginning with nickels and pennies. They are progressing to word problems to lay the foundation for solving narrative-based mathematical challenges.





In Science, we're learning about how plants grow, what they need to thrive, and exploring their detailed structure. Our class has enjoyed exploring and tasting fruits and vegetables, extracting their seeds with excitement. Next, we'll embark on the journey of planting these seeds and observing their growth with anticipation.




THIRD GRADE
